[redacted] was interviewed at his place of employment, Anadarko Petroleum Corporation, 501 North Division Boulevard, Platteville, Colorado. Agent [redacted] Colorado Bureau of Investigation, was also present during the course of the interview. After being advised of the identities of the interviewing agents and the nature of the interview, [redacted] provided the following information:

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[redacted] of Anadarko's operations center. He is familiar with [redacted] but [redacted] recommended interviewing agents speak with [redacted] and other co-workers for additional information regarding [redacted]

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Anadarko maintains approximately 1,200 to 1,500 "batteries," or oil production sites, in a geographical area generally constrained by Greeley to the north, Interstate 470 to the south, Interstate 76 to the east and Interstate 25 to the west.

These sites vary between Exploration and Production (E and P) and Midstream. Midstream sites are manned 24 hours a day, 7 days a week.

E and P sites are further divided into vertical and horizontal sites. Vertical sites are the older type of the two, and [redacted] worked as a [redacted]

Batteries are not typically access controlled beyond simple secured gates. These locking mechanisms do not keep a log of access times or persons accessing the sites. Some newer facilities may monitor access in and out and have cameras, but most sites do not maintain records of entry or exit of personnel.

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Vertical sites are generally managed "by exception." Operators maintaining vertical sites are given a certain number of wells to maintain, and these sites are typically seen approximately every few days to once a week in order to ensure proper function.

Operators work different types of shifts. Some may work seven days on and seven days off or eight days on and six days off. A typical work day may be ten hours or more.

Anadarko work trucks are equipped with GPS monitoring. [REDACTED] was not sure of the frequency in which the GPS updates in relation to a vehicle's location, but he believed it may update every one to ten minutes. Anadarko uses a service called Geo Tab. This service tracks information to include, but not limited to, seat belt use, hard acceleration and deceleration and speed. Work truck use is limited to work related tasks.

Operators also utilize a messaging application called Group Me to send and receive messages to other crews and the operations center regarding tasks, locations and other work related information. Group Me is typically accessed by employees' work telephones.

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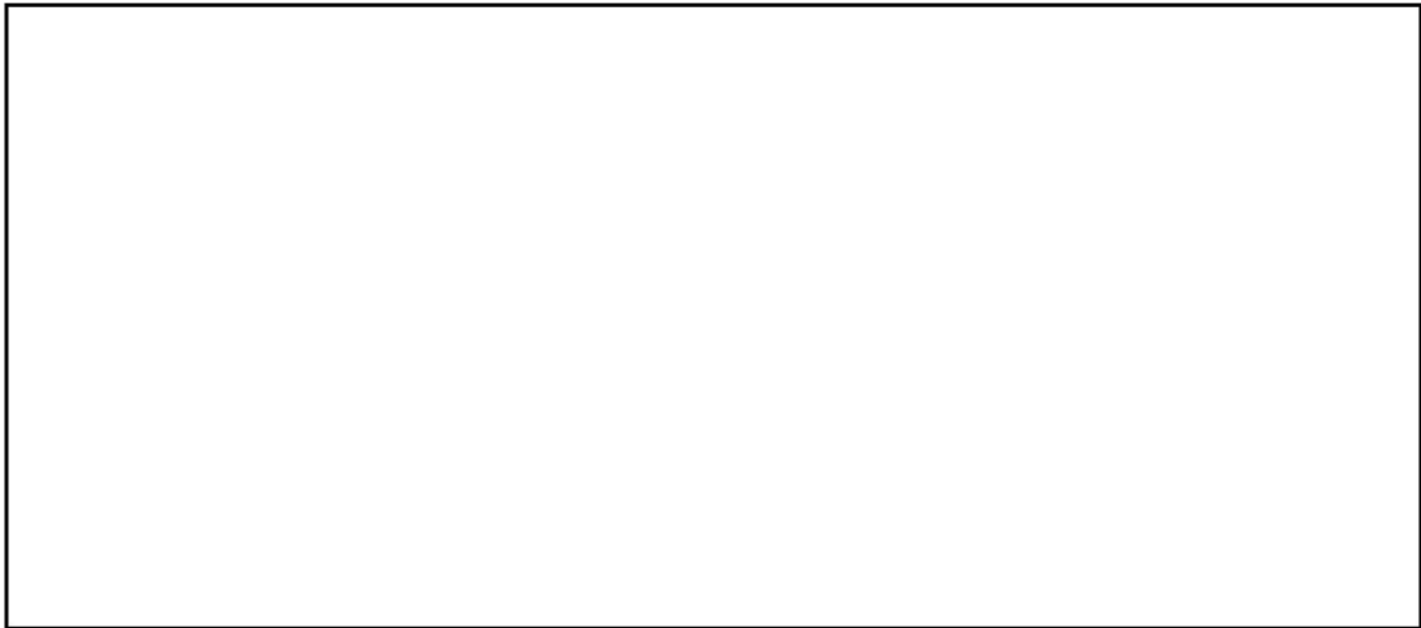

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Writer responded to the residence on 08/15/2018, and met SA [redacted] with the Colorado Bureau of Investigation (CBI). SA [redacted] directed Writer to the location of the Netgear N900. SA [redacted] advised the home owner, [redacted] provided consent to search the Netgear N900. Writer took photographs of the Netgear N900's location and identifying labels on the Netgear N900 (images will be maintained digitally in the 1A section of the case file).
