

ORDERED as follows:

1. Defendant Bruna Mazzolo's emergent application to be granted temporary physical custody of the parties' minor child, Corey Mazzolo ("Corey") (D.C.H. 05-01-2015), while DCPP completes its ongoing investigation, is hereby **DENIED WITHOUT PREJUDICE**. To be granted emergent relief through an order to show cause in the

family division, the movant must demonstrate that the minor child is in danger of imminent and irreparable harm. *Crowe v. DeGolia*, 90 N.J. 126 (1982). Here, Defendant Bruna Mazzolo certifies that she has concerns that the parties' minor child Corey has sustained injuries such as bruising and cuts from physical abuse perpetrated by Defendant Christopher Gregor. Defendant Bruna Mazzolo further certifies that Defendant Christopher Gregor refuses to allow her to take Corey to a doctor for his injuries to be reviewed. The Court has been afforded an opportunity to review a letter dated April 1, 2015, submitted by DCPP outlining its preliminary findings on this matter. Upon review of DCPP's preliminary investigatory findings, the Court does not find that the parties' minor child, Corey, is in danger of imminent and irreparable harm. Therefore, the Court does not find a temporary modification of the parties' custody and parenting time arrangement appropriate at this time.
