**NARRATIVE**

On 02/16/2020 at 23:05, Deputies were dispatched to 4360 Pinson Valley Parkway after the Sheriff's Office received multiple calls of gunshots coming from inside the trailer park at that location. One caller reported that at lot #8, there were two males fighting outside and they were seen either unloading or loading large weapons.

Deputies McKinney, White, and Godber arrived on scene and could hear loud

arguing coming from inside the trailer at lot #8, from the street. Deputies knocked on the door, which was answered by a Hispanic male, later identified as Giovanni Loyola. Deputies explained why they were there and asked for him to step down off the steps so they could check the well being of other individuals inside the residence. He immediately got loud with Deputies refusing to come down off the steps. Deputies could also observe that he had slurred speech and it was apparent he was intoxicated. At that time, Dep. Godber attempted to detain Loyola where he immediately became combative pushing Dep. Godber away. Deputies took Loyola to the ground very quickly and ordered him to put his hands behind his back. He struggled with Deputies in an attempt to pull his hands away and prevent them from putting him in handcuffs. After refusing several commands to stop resisting and put his hands behind his back, Deputies overcame his efforts and placed him in handcuffs with the least amount of force necessary to do so. He sustained some scratches to his face, however refused medics. While in handcuffs he continued to be loud and belligerent causing residents of other trailers to come outside to see what was going on. Deputies McKinney and White went inside Loyola's trailer at that time and conducted a safety sweep to see if anyone had been shot or was injured from an apparent fight, which was the initial complaint. After speaking with Loyola's mother and brother inside the residence, it turned out that Loyola had been in a fight with two of his other brothers after having several alcoholic beverages. The two unknown brothers left the scene prior to Deputies arriving. After the scene was secure and Deputies could positively identify Loyola, dispatch confirmed that he had (4) outstanding warrants with three surrounding agencies, which were Tarrant PD, Pelham PD, and Homewood PD. Due to his loud and offensive behavior which caused alarm to several of his neighbors and for fighting and resisting Deputies, he was placed under arrest. He was then transported to the Jefferson County Jail by Dep. White and held for Disorderly Conduct and Resisting Arrest. Each charge held a \$300 bond.
